Since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, Oregon has seen a major expansion in telehealth access, utilization, and payment. As the state looks forward toward the future of telehealth, the Oregon Health Authority and the Department of Consumer and Business Services are seeking input from stakeholders in a series of listening sessions. The goal is to discuss lessons learned, successes to build on, and opportunities for improvement. These sessions are an important opportunity to help inform next steps in telehealth coverage and payment policies for Oregon.
